It was a really fun day all round - we sold lots of clothes and met lots of lovely people. Of course the team couldn't resist cuddling all the gorgeous puppies aswell!









Over the last few months we have seen Cafe Leep go from strength to strenth. Originally just open three days a week for takeaway service the cafe is now back to a full five day week service with full menu. Our customers have been enjoying sitting indoors and the smell of fresh coffee made in the new barista machine too.

The cafe now accepts card payments and the trainees and members have already mastered the new till and payment system. The Trainees now start work at 9am which has been a great way to extend their training with us but is also good practice for them being ready for work during normal office hours.

It's been fantastic to see the cafe slowly rebuild after Covid and we are so proud that it is now officially recommended by The Restaurant Guru Guide 2021!



NVQ SUCCESS!

Finally after months of training online during lockdown, office and café closures, COVID rule changes, and staff isolating we finally booked the first Food Safety in Catering Level 2 NVQ exam session!

There is a bit of a backstory for everyone taking these exams and I am truly proud of everyone who had to sit the exam under strict COVID conditions.

Firstly, Joe was about to resit his exam before lockdown as his initial certificate he gained with Café Leep back in 2016 had expired. He attended some of our online food safety sessions during lockdown to keep his knowledge fresh.

Once January 2021 rolled round, we were ready to open the café and get Joe in for his exam. However, lockdown struck again and we were back at home. However, once we were finally allowed to reopen in April with our trainees, Joe was by this time a paid member of staff. This is something that we're very proud of! During his time back in café, he's shown just how much of an asset he is; not just in the café but also in the classroom. Joe has shown how much he knows and has even run some sessions with the trainees. This being said, I had absolutely no doubt that Joe would pass his exam with flying colours and do you know what? He did! He's in fact the first person we have trained with a learning disability to get 100%






CONGRATULATIONS...

Due to lockdown we found it hard to arrange the exam. Like Joe, we were planning on a January 2021 exam; however lockdown halted that idea! Despite the frustrations of COVID, Sapphire finally got to take her exam in June 2021 wearing her mask on a hot day and completing it on her own without the help of a permitted reader. This is a success story in its own right as Sapphire gained all her knowledge with online teaching via Facebook and Zoom. Oh, and did we say that she passed? Yes she did and we are ever so proud! We hope Sapphire can take her knowledge to one of her many jobs and volunteer roles around Leeds!

Our 4th candidate was the super volunteer for Leep1, Ouahiba. She is a valued member of the team and the members enjoy having her help with all the groups that Leep1 run. As you may have guessed Ouahiba's first language is not English. So... having to listen to me rant on about contamination and anaphylaxis in broad Yorkshire may not have been the easiest lesson in the world. However, I'm so pleased to say that Ouahiba did an amazing job using her allotted time well to score very highly and pass her exam! Very well done Ouahiba!



Last but by no means least, Leep1's newest staff member, Janine took her revision pretty seriously and it was reflected in the tremendous score that she got on her exam that took her all of 10 minutes! Janine must've also benefited from attending some of our online fun quiz sessions too! All in all, it took us forever to get this exam arranged for one reason or another! However, it was totally worth waiting for as the results speak for themselves! Congratulations everyone. I'm very proud of you all!


